

## WoMin detailed action plan, 2014

This action plan must be read against the programme goal, high level outcomes and intermediate outcomes for the three-year programme, as well as Section 4 of the wider three-year proposal on the Theory of Change and Overall Strategy. There are six areas of work, with specific actions included under each.
